The Committee may make recommendations to the Bureau.

 - Assembly Bill 54 (Kiley) This bill prohibits DCA boards and bureaus from revoking a license for failure to comply with any COVID-19 emergency orders, unless the board can prove that lack of compliance resulted in the transmission of COVID-19.
 - Senate Bill 102 (Melendez) This bill prohibits DCA boards and bureaus from revoking a license for failure to comply with any COVID-19 emergency orders, unless the board can prove that lack of compliance resulted in the transmission of COVID-19.
 - Assembly Bill 229 (Holden) Effective January 1, 2023, this bill expands the Power to Arrest and training in the carrying and usage of firearms to include "appropriate use of force" training and extends the courses by two hours. The Bureau will work with POST to develop the course outline. This bill makes "Weapons of Mass Destruction and Terrorism Awareness" an elective course only. Additionally, the bill clarifies that an armed security guard must be an employee of a private patrol operator.
